Program Information

About Youth Leadership Broward

Youth Leadership Broward (YLB), a program of Leadership Broward Foundation (LBF), is a nine-month program that provides an opportunity for students to **gain real-life experiences** through interactions with community leaders from businesses, government agencies, and civic organizations; **develop essential leadership skills** such as team building, conflict resolution, time management, public speaking and goal setting; and **impact the community** through an ongoing service project throughout the year. Each year, fifty-five current high school sophomores from across Broward County are selected to participate in this program during their junior year.

Eligibility

Applications are open to all current **sophomores** attending a Broward County public or private high school who meet the following criteria:

- Hold a grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- Demonstrate leadership in their schools and/or community
- Have an interest in enhancing their leadership skills and knowledge of Broward County
- Receive approval by a high school principal and/or guidance counselor

Time Commitment (See Calendar of Dates)

- Attend program orientation, opening retreat, leadership day, and graduation day and evening
- Attend at least four (4) of the six (6) monthly program days which take place on school days from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- Participate in a mandatory ongoing community service project outside of YLB and school hours

Student Benefits

- Develop leadership and communication skills
- Get a backstage pass to Broward County
- Receive up to 30 community service hours
- Build resume and college application
- Interact with business and community leaders
- Meet diverse group of peers from different schools

Tuition

The cost of the program is \$800 and covers all program costs including bus transportation and lunch on each of the days. Financial aid is available based on need. A \$20 application fee is due at time of submitting the application which will be put towards the final tuition if accepted into the program. If not accepted the \$20 application fee will be refunded. Final payment must be paid in full by July 7, 2019.

May 23, 2019:

Accepted students must attend a mandatory program orientation.
